



Polyneuropathy and Peripheral Neuropathy

Peripheral neuropathy describes damage to the peripheral nervous system, the vast communications network that transmits information from the brain and spinal cord (the central nervous system) to every other part of the body. Peripheral nerves also send sensory information back to the brain and spinal cord, such as a message that the feet are cold or a finger is burned. Damage to the peripheral nervous system interferes with these vital connections. **Polyneuropathy** is the simultaneous malfunction of many peripheral nerves throughout the body. Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS) is a type of acute polyneuropathy and chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy (CIDP) is the chronic version of GBS.
