In 2008, the U.S. Administration for Community Living (<http://www.hhs.gov/acl/>) began a collaboration with the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) (<http://www.va.gov/health/default.asp>) to serve veterans of all ages at risk of nursing home placement through the Veteran Directed Home and Community Based Service Program (VD-HCBS). VD-HCBS is a package of services that the VA purchases from Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) and/or SUAs on behalf of eligible veterans. The VD-HCBS program provides Veterans the opportunity to self-direct their long-term supports and services that enable them to avoid institutionalization and continue to live independently at home. Veterans enrolled in VDCP have the opportunity to manage their own flexible budgets, to decide for themselves what mix of goods and services best meet their needs, and to hire and supervise their own workers. The Aging Network provides facilitated assessment and care/service planning, arranges fiscal management services, and provides ongoing options counseling and support to veterans.
